## RED LION: New Big Cat on the Block

The opening of the Red Lion on Rockwell south of Lawrence means that we now have a taste of England in the GRO neighborhood. Since we already have tastes of Africa, Greece, the Philippines, Viet Nam, Sweden and others within or along our area, this is a welcome addition, especially since the food is lots better than in most actual English pubs and restaurants (writer's note: neither the words "chef" nor "cuisine" are English, with good reason).

In fact, the Lion, a transplant from the old Red Lion in Lincoln Park, has tremendously good food. Appetizers worth noting include deep-fried olives in a beer batter with blue cheese, served sizzling hot on a skewer, and welsh rarebit, which is neither welsh nor a rabbit, but is a delicious glut of toasted cheese and tomato. A salad to try is the cold chicken curry with ginger sauce. For around \$10 you can dine on excellent fish and chips, Cornish pasty or veggie pasty (both with a light flaky crust) and good home-made coleslaw or chicken with coconut curry sauce. For a few bucks less there are first-rate sandwiches such as burgers, shepherd's pie and chicken tandoori. Bread pudding for dessert is a house specialty. And while this eater avoided the more Englishy items like bubble and squeak or bangers and mash, that doesn't mean you should.

The Lion has a warm decor and feel, simple, tasteful and English: pictures of sailing ships and the Beatles. Background music is similarly tasteful and English: classic rock, the Beatles.

The place just opened, so for now there's no liquor license, but it's already kid-friendly, people-friendly and hungry guy-friendly. As the Brits say, bon appetite.
