Solar Panels at HarvesTime

It's hard not to notice the new solar panels at HarvesTime Foods, 2632 W. Lawrence. HarvesTime, which has shown an active interest in environmental sustainability, replaced its old canvas awning with solar panels and a new sign in November.

"We are trying to stay a little bit greener and healthier for the environment," said Chris Dallas, one of the owners, about the decision to install the solar panels. "Reducing our footprint, saving energy we consume and making it better for the environment. We needed to replace the old awning, and also needed a sign since it was on the old awning. We needed to put a sign on the building, to make the whole store look uniform from the outside." The new solar panel design fits both the advertising and structural needs for replacing the old awning. "We stand for a happier, cleaner, healthier environment."

Another goal was to lower the electric bill. The store is not using a battery array and has its system set up to use electricity generated by the panels before using electricity from the grid. "Everything that is produced by the solar panels is consumed immediately before we get anything from ComEd," said Chris Dallas.

The solar panels face both east and south. The panels facing east have been beneficial but not as much as the south-facing panels. Mr. Dallas explained, "I would say they produce quite a bit of electricity, but they don't come close to what our southern panels are producing."

National Do Not Call Registry

Registering with the National Do Not Call Registry gives you a choice about whether to receive telemarketing calls at home.

Consumers can register on-line for the national do-not-call registry by going to www.donotcall.gov. To register by phone, call 1-888-382-1222; for TTY call 1-866-290-4236. You must call from the phone number you wish to register. Most telemarketers should not call your number once it has been on the registry for 31 days. If they do, you can file a complaint at the Website. You can register your home or mobile phone for free.

Registration will not expire. Telephone numbers placed on the National Do Not Call Registrywill remain on it permanently due to the Do-Not-Call Improvement Act of 2007, which became law in February 2008.

Researching the different solar products available was a three-year process. Compatibility with the electrical system and concern about the origin of manufacture were both important.

"We had to find a domestic company; there were a few in Illinois. Our region is not the most popular with solar companies. We wanted to choose a company that fits what we like best and chose Solar Service Inc. Their outlook was very much like mine: to use strictly American-made products. We are using American-made panels, even though there are many Chinese panels. There is knowledge behind the American installers. It [all] has to be connected together and connected to our in-store grid," Mr. Dallas said. The owners declined lower cost offers. "We had a couple of companies give lower prices to make their bids more palatable, but they were using Chinese products."

Knowing the total financial benefit of savings on the cost of electricity will

evolve over the course of time.

"Grocery stores use a lot of electricity. It's kind of hard to estimate [savings] accurately until we have a full year under our belt," he said, "although there is a noticeable difference in electricity generated on sunny days versus cloudy days, and expected variations in electricity produced in different seasons." Understanding the financial

benefits will be ongoing over the years. "We've got projections where we are looking at a payback in ten years, depending on electric rates. If the rates go up, the return on investment will be longer. From a building and investment perspective, if I were just to put signs on the building, when would I get that money back? Never."
