Save Your Ash Fundraiser

Neighbors, we still need your help! The ash trees in our parkways are in danger from an invasive bug called the Emerald Ash Borer. This bug is decimating the ash tree population and will likely succeed in killing all the ash trees in Chicago in the next three years if nothing is done.

Thankfully, there is a treatment that can protect the ashes. We are fundraising to save all the ash trees in our neighborhood - around 80 trees! A donation of \$100 would cover the treatment for one tree, which will keep that tree safe for three years. However, a donation of any value will help. If you have a tree in your parkway that you'd like to save and you can't afford the full treatment, please reach out. GRO is donating up to \$2,500 to supplement this fundraising effort.

While we hope that all 80 trees can be saved, an arborist will make the final determination regarding a tree's health. If you donated money to save a tree that is too sick to save, we will apply your donation to save a nearby, healthy ash tree. Having healthy trees in our neighborhood, regardless of location, benefits us all!

FREE TREES from OpenLands

Do you need a parkway tree? Have you been waiting for the city to respond to your tree request for years? WAIT NO MORE! This fall, OpenLands will help GRO plant up to 40 FREE trees in our neighborhood parkways. The trees provided will be mostly large, urban-tolerant, native shade trees, such as oaks, northern catalpa, and Kentucky coffee trees, and they will be approximately two inches thick and ten feet tall.

The application deadline is June 1, so please reach out soon! While the trees are provided to neighbors at no cost, OpenLands asks folks who are able to contribute \$100 towards the planting of their tree. This allows OpenLands to protect natural and open spaces across our great city.
