Guatemala Meets Rockwell

The Guatemalan restaurant Luna de Xelaju (pronounced shay-lah-HOO) at 4755 N. Rockwell is under new management and open every day for breakfast, lunch, and dinner from 9:00 a.m. until 8:30 p.m. (9:30 p.m. on Friday and Saturday). The new owners are brothers Juanfran and Ricardo Ovalle and sister Clara Lopez. It is their first restaurant venture but you wouldn't know it.

A group of GRO regulars and I checked it out for breakfast on a recent Saturday and were pleasantly surprised. Breakfast offerings include pancakes served with eggs and fried plantains, steak and eggs with black beans, and huevos rancheros. The eggs were enhanced with their Guatemalan sauce. The owners could not have been more accommodating of our special requests.

Lunch and dinner selections include Pepian estilo quetzalteco, a tasty chicken dish with a creamy mole sauce, Salpicon, a cold shredded beef dish with lime and cilantro, and a chicken taco salad with excellent guacamole. Atol de elote, a hot beverage made with corn, is a sweet treat.

I can't wait to check out some of their weekend specials and small dishes listed under "Guatemalan Cravings." Very reasonable prices, pleasant service, and a host of delicious choices make Luna de Xelaju worth a visit (or two or three...).

PICKUP TRUCK SURVEY

The City of Chicago enacted a law restricting the parking of commercial trucks and junk vehicles on City streets to maintain safety in residential neighborhoods, preserve the residential feel in our neighborhoods and to improve parking availability in densely populated areas.

Currently, the 47th Ward does not allow pickup trucks to park on any street in the ward. Recently, some of our residents have expressed concern regarding the restriction of pickup trucks in our neighborhoods.

Other Wards in the City allow pickup trucks to park on the street through a permit process. A residential truck permit allows pickup trucks weighing less than 4500 pounds to be parked in residential areas near the residence of the registered owner of the vehicle.
