Jacob Playlot Update

Thanks to everyone who circulated and signed the petition to the CTA. More than 250 physical signatures were collected from residents of the neighborhood as well as 192 online (Thanks to Sarah Reiser for setting it up), requesting that CTA president Forest Claypool explore options to allow the land to remain in public ownership, ideally as expanded space for Jacob Playlot. We have found out that no bids to purchase it were submitted before the May 30 deadline. Alderman Pawar and Alderman O'Connor have been looking into the use of TIF funds and other possible sources to purchase the land from the CTA.

Tomatoes, peppers, eggplant, kale, watermelon, pumpkin, zucchini, basil, and raspberries have been planted so park users can watch them grow. If something looks ripe, feel free to harvest it, and share it with others if you can. Thanks to Les Kniskern and Whole Foods for donating many of the plants.
