**Get Rid of Household Hazardous Waste and Electronics!**

Drop off your unwanted household chemicals, paints, used motor oils, and computers at the Northeastern Illinois University parking lot at 5500 N. St. Louis on Saturday, October 13 from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Or you can take your household hazardous waste to the new city-wide Household Chemicals and Computer Recycling Facility at 1150 N. North Branch (two blocks east of the Kennedy Expressway at Division). The facility is open year-round on Tuesdays from 7:00 a.m.–12:00 p.m., Thursdays from 2:00 p.m.–7:00 p.m., and the first Saturday of every month from 8:00 a.m.–3:00 p.m.

## BLUE CART MADE EASY

For those of us who live in the 47th Ward, Blue Cart recycling has arrived. We are now one of only 7 wards in the city to be a test area. It is remarkably simple: you put all of your recyclables, bagged or loose (my recommendation is LOOSE), into your Blue Cart. Almost everything is recyclable (look for a big decal on top of your cart showing what goes inside), except for #1 be those "To Go" cups and containers. Look for the recycle symbol and on food/drink containers. Plastic bags of all kinds, cellophane, and of course real garbage still go into the regular Black Carts.

All glass, plastic (but not # 6), metal, and all types of paper, including newspaper, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, and cardboard boxes, all go in together. It is VERY IMPORTANT to break down your boxes and large plastic jugs. The pickups are only every other week for now, and you need to be able to get everything inside and close the lid, so that the recyclables are in good condition and can be processed to be reused. Items inside the Blue Cart are mechanically sorted. If you recycle so much that you need another Blue Cart, call 311, and a Black Cart will be removed. Real Black Cart garbage is going to be much less when the recyclables are taken out.

Yard waste can go in any sort of bag or box, NEXT TO YOUR Black Cart, and is collected every week April to November.

I am a Recycling Block Captain for the 4400-4500 Campbell/Artesian alley and hope to remind, help, educate, and pressure all of my neighbors to recycle, and you should too. This is important.

## Recycling Rebate for Condos

Did you know that all condominium associations, cooperative apartment buildings, and townhouses who are not eligible to receive City refuse collection services are eligible to apply for a condo refuse rebate? The association will receive a maximum of \$75.00 per residential unit or the total amount of the refuse bills for the period you are filing, whichever is the lesser amount.

All buildings eligible for this rebate have one year to file. Applications are available at the Ward 47 office or at <http://www.committeefinance.org/condo/index.asp>, and the completed application and all necessary documents must be submitted to the Ward 47 office.
