Tax News

On Monday, November 16, GRO president Tom Kosinski testified before the Chicago city council finance committee on behalf of Alderman Gene Schulner's resolution that the city council endorse the renewal of the 7% tax cap due to expire in 2010.

Tom joined Barb Head, TRAC president, Dan Farley, chairman of the Ravenswood Community Council, Clovis Evans, representative from WECAN (Woodlawn East Community and Neighbors Inc.), Art Lyon from the Center for Economic Policy Analysis and Alderman Schulner in urging the Finance Committee to request the council's adoption of the resolution.

Property Tax Watch

In speaking with my neighbors, I have learned that many of you who qualify for the Long-Time Occupant Exemption may have received it last year but didn't see it on this year's tax bill. This may be because it is an exemption you have to apply for every year.

Here's how it works. If you have lived in your home as the primary residence for 10 years or more, and earn a combined household income of less than \$100,000, you may qualify for a 10% assessment cap. If you have a combined household income of less than \$75,000, you may qualify for a 7% assessment cap. There is no "cap on the cap" for this exemption and depending on the increase in your home's value over the past triennial there could be substantial savings. One homeowner I assisted saw a reduction of \$1,200 in her tax bill and another neighbor realized a \$2,200 savings.

The Assessor's Office says there is no limitation on when you may apply for this exemption, and long-time occupants may still be eligible for a refund on 2008 or 2007 property tax bills (2007 was the first year of the Long-Time Occupant Exemption).

As many of you know, I continue to work with Tax Reform Action Coalition (TRAC), and am a proponent of a Permanent Assessment Cap on our Cook County property taxes. I encourage you to sign up for TRAC's e-mail alerts at www.trac-il.org.

As your neighbor, I'm available to take a look at your individual property tax bills, assist in filing for your exemptions, or review other property tax issues. I'm here purely as an advocate, not an attorney, but still, a nominal donation based on the amount of work required is appreciated. A favorite from 30 years ago, a library stool, one of those that has little wheels on it, but stops and is very sturdy when you step down on it. Very good for the short person, or anyone who has high shelves or bookcases.

An atomic clock radio and indoor outdoor thermometer. This should have an outside sensor which requires a battery, very easy to install.
