Chicago Winter Garden Plants That Dazzle Even in Snow

Tired of staring at leafless trees and patches of snow in your yard each winter? Here are seven great winter garden plants that add greenery and cool shapes, and will even blossom outside your window in the heart of winter. Hardy across many zones (Chicago is zone 5a), these plants make terrific additions to your garden.

Flowering quince: This deciduous thorny shrub can stretch up to 8 feet wide, creating a natural fencing, and puts on a big show of blossoms in winter.

Snowdrop: One of the first blossoms of late winter, snowdrops prefer to hide away in rock gardens and under taller shrubs.

Boxwood: Evergreen boxwood hedges, easy to grow and shape, make your winter garden come alive with forms that add texture.

Winterberry: This deciduous version of holly loses its leaves in late fall, leaving behind dazzling sprays of lipstick-red berries when a male is paired with a female.

Witch hazel: Fragrant in summer, this sizable shrub has clusters of spidery red-and-yellow flowers that blaze like little suns in the midst of winter.

Christmas rose: This winter-loving plant blossoms from late December through early spring on stout stems that rise above modest snowfalls.

Mock rush: A tough, upright ornamental grass that will poke through winter's snows and give your garden lots of visual interest.
