Tale of Two Meals

Two new grab-n-go food places have opened recently at the opposite edges of the GRO neighborhood, as far apart from each other in every way as you could imagine. They are Best Sub Corner, at 2407 W. Lawrence, and Steingold Station, next to the Francisco Brown line stop.

Steingold's, a mini-spinoff of a nouveau-deli at 1840 W. Irving Park, has all the pros and cons of upscale eating: the coffee is excellent (Sparrow's), the turkey and corned beef are very high quality, and they even have Dr. Brown's sodas. On the downside, it is quite pricey, portions are small, the selections are very limited (two or three kinds of bagel and cream cheeses, four kinds of sandwiches), and the creative use of spices is so strong that the basic tastes of the whitefish salad and the turkey salad are buried. With only a single counter with three seats, you are clearly supposed to buy to-go/ At the other end of the spectrum is Best Sub Corner, a five-table shop open seven days a week for 14 to 16 hours a day. Prices are reasonable, portions large and the variety is immense, essentially every fast food you could think of: nine subs, chicken, burgers, sandwiches, pizza puffs. The downside: like most fast food venues, everything but the subs is frozen, and of middling quality.

Life is a series of trade-offs, and each of these places has staked out its market. You get to choose.
